### **ABOUT SVDP**

Incorporated in 1955 in Eugene, Ore., St. Vincent de Paul Society of Lane County (SVdP) today is the largest nonprofit human-services agency in the county and one of the leading affordable-housing developers in the state. SVdP owns and operates more than 1,600 units of affordable housing for low-income residents and helps more than 35,000 people annually through a social safety net of human services. This includes sheltering 500-600 houseless people *every night* in Eugene-Springfield, and hundreds more when the lifesaving Egan Warming Centers activate during cold weather.



SVdP currently operates a network of 13 St. Vinnie's retail-thrift stores and one used-car lot in Oregon; an extensive online book sales program; the nation's first successful and still largest mattressrecycling operation (DR3 Recyling); and a variety of other waste-based recycling, resale and manufacturing enterprises all designed to create sustainable jobs and revenue to support SVdP's charitable efforts. SVdP also helps other nonprofits across the country to develop similarly sustainable business models through its mentorship program, Cascade Alliance.

### LEADERS' MESSAGE

Here at St. Vincent de Paul Society of Lane County (SVdP), we are in the business of **good for our community**. And what a time it was for that business during the past fiscal year (Oct. 31, 2021-Sept. 30, 2022), which is the focus of this report. Thanks to generous **supporters like you**, grant funders and sponsors, and community partners, we made remarkable strides forward in housing and human services during the year.

We welcomed residents to 53 new units of affordable housing at **Iris Place**. We gave rise to **The Phoenix House**, a sober-living program for unsheltered women. We commenced construction of **Ascend Home**, a case-managed supportive housing property for families experiencing homelessness. We improved access to all of our emergency family services by uniting them at one site, **First Place Family Center** and **Night Shelter Annex**. And we opened two **Safe Sleep Sites** with the City of Eugene, providing 86 indoor tents and 55 vehicle camp sites for unhoused individuals.

We opened our first **new St. Vinnie's store** since 2019, at 888 Garfield St. in west Eugene — in the front of a former steel plant soon to be a manufactured-home factory. That project, **HOPE Community Corp.**, will operate as a nonprofit partner of SVdP to build real solutions to the state's affordable-housing crisis.

Now to reflect on a few of our service numbers from the year: **We provided shelter** for 2,490 adults and 1,037 families experiencing homelessness; prepared more than **300,000 meals** for shelter guests; **housed 2,060 residents** in our affordable-housing properties; and **served 1,064 veterans**, which included housing 333 of them.

On the **environmental stewardship** front, we kept 20,956,379 pounds of material out of landfills during the year. We also **recycled 396,028 mattresses**, and inspired the passage of Oregon's mattress-stewardship bill to take effect in 2024. We are already the nation's largest mattress recycler, and this law will allow us to prevent more waste, create more jobs, and better **support our charitable work**.

Of course, in this business of good we're in, **the work is never done**, and the need for what we do has never been greater. With you as financial contibutors, volunteers, and St. Vinnie's retail-thrift shoppers/donors, we can do increasing amounts of good for our community. It is our business, after all. **We thank you for your support!**






